Please note particularly that you are not entitled to elaborate in writing on or make further submissions in relation to the grounds of appeal stated in your Notice of Appeal or to submit further grounds of appeal, and any such elaboration, submissions or further grounds of appeal received by the Board shall not be considered by it. This is provided for in Section 41(3) of the Act.

Section 56(2)(a) of the Act requires that the Board endeavour to determine an appeal within a period of four months beginning on the date of receipt by the Board of the Notice of Appeal. The Board reviewed this timescale at its meeting on 10 February 2022 and has formed the view that it will not be in position to
