

I refer to the above Appeals which has been remitted to the Aquaculture Licences Appeals Board (the Board) for further consideration.

Following remittal of the Appeals, the Board carried out an updated Screening for Appropriate Assessment (AA) for each appeal and determined that it cannot be excluded on the basis of objective scientific information that the proposed aquaculture activities the subject of the Appeals, either individually or in combination with other plans or projects, will have a significant impact on European Sites. A copy of the Screening Reports relevant to each Appeal, as prepared by the Board's Technical Advisor and adopted by the Board, are all publicly available on ALAB's website at the following link:

It is noted that Lough Swilly SPA, Roaninish SPA and Lough Foyle SPA were not considered for the purposes of Stage 2 AA in the Natura Impact Statement (NIS) dated September 2023.

In light of the additional European sites which have been screened in for AA and, having regard to the passage of time since the original NIS was submitted, including the fact that activities were commenced on sites T12/407B, T12/515A and T12/414A after the Board made its now quashed Determination in May 2024, the Board has requested that the Licence Applicants submit an updated NIS or Statements in respect of the activities pursuant to Regulation 42(3) of the 2011 Regulations.

The updated NIS or Statements are required to be submitted to the Board within 5 months from the date of the notices issued to the license Applicants, and not later than 14 May 2026. Upon receipt of the updated NIS or Statements, you will be given an opportunity to make a submission or observation in respect of the further information received, in accordance with the 2011 Regulations.
