

Freshwater pearl mussel in Dromagowlane River

The presence of the mouth of the Dromagowiane River, 1.2 km north of the proposed iteace area, was not mentioned in either the Environmental impact Statement (EIS) or the Environmental impact Assusance submitted as part of the Appeal to the Board. The Board notes that some of the Appealment submitted it that this river supports colonies of freshwater pearl mussel. The Board requires clarification from you as to whether the Oromagowiana River does or does not support colonies of freshwater pearl mussel.

In accordance with section 47 (1) (a) of the Act, the Board requires this information within 28 days of receipt of this letter.

Please note that if the documents, particulars or other information specified above is not received before the expiration of the period specified above, or such later period as may be agreed by the Board, the Board will, without further reference to you, determine the appeal.

Please also note that a person who refuses or falls to comply with a requirement under subsection (1)(a) shall be guilty of an offence.

On behalf of the Department of Arts, Heritage, Regional, Rural and Gaeltacht Affairs I refer to the above. Outlined below please find the Nature Conservation observations.

The freshwater pearl mussel (Margaritifera margaritifera) is known to occur in the Trafrask or Dromagowlane River, Beara Peninsula, Co. Cork. The river was assessed as having a relatively large population of the species (Ross, 2009). 
