FISHERIES (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1997 (NO. 23) & FORESHORE ACT, 1933 (NO. 12) NOTICE OF DECISION TO GRANT AQUACULTURE AND FORESHORE LICENSES. The Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine has decided to grant an Aquaculture License and a Foreshore License to, Bradán Fanad Teo t/a Marine Harvest Ireland, KINDRUM, FANAD, LETTERKENNY, CO. DONEGAL, REF: T5/555 for the cultivation of Atlantic Salmon: Salmo Salar on a site on the foreshore at SHOT HEAD, BANTRY BAY, CO. CORK.

Appellant's particular interest in the outcome of the appeal:

I REQUEST SALMON FARM LICENSE T5/555 IS WITHDRAWN. THE DECISION TO APROVE THE MARINE HARVEST LICENCE APPLICATION FOR SHOT HEAD BANTRY BAY WAS PROCEDURALLY FLAWED, AND BASED ON BIASED INFORMATION RATHER THAN THE FULL COHORT OF EVIDENCE AVAILABLE.

Outline the grounds of appeal (and, if necessary, on additional page(s) give full grounds of the appeal and the reasons, considerations and arguments on which they are based):

The scientific advice of the Marine Institute has been put forward by the Department Of Agriculture Food And The Marine in the decision to grant the Licence T5/555 for salmon farming at Shot Head in Bantry Bay. The impression given is the decision is purely evidence based. However, the Marine Institute is not a free agent. The Marine Institute is established by legislation – The 1991 Marine Institute Act – and part of its function is to evaluate and advise the Department on proposals under Section (4)(2)(h) of the Act. It follows from this that the evaluation and advice must be based on scientific evidence only, must be independent and impartial, and must be seen to be so in the public eye.

However, despite the legislation, the Department has placed the staffing allocation and operating budget of the Marine Institute under the direct control of the Department's Fisheries Division rather than under one of the numerous other non-Fisheries Divisions within the Department. The primary function of the Fisheries Division is the development of the industry including aquaculture (and salmon farming). This is reinforced in current Government policy and programmes, which propose a significant expansion of salmon farming.

The Department has been criticised as being far too close to industry representatives, including Marine Harvest who now operate over 80% of Ireland's salmon farms. Indeed the Minister himself has met with Marine Harvest representatives, and even supported a meeting with Marine Harvest and the Taoiseach himself.

The conflict of interest that arises for the Marine Institute from the Department's action is very clear. The advice prepared by the Marine Institute is not free from influence by the Department's Fisheries Division.

Accordingly the decision of the Minister to approve the Marine Harvest License T5/555 is procedurally flawed. We therefore request the Licence is withdrawn.
